9. School Safety Enhancements

To enhance the safety of our students and staff within the school, we have introduced new safety measures with effect from Term 3, 2025. They are as follows:

1) **New Footpath and Designated Drop-Off Points**

A clearly marked footpath, highlighted with painted footprints, now guides students and staff safely from the drop-off area to the school building. In addition, four designated vehicle drop-off points have been introduced to ensure safe and orderly disembarkation.

We kindly request all drivers to use only these designated drop-off points. This simple action greatly reduces congestion and enhances safety near the school entrance.



2) **New 'STOP' Sign Light Boxes with Motion Detectors at Gate 4**

We have installed motion-activated 'STOP' sign light boxes at both ends of the zebra crossing near Gate 4. These light boxes automatically illuminate when a pedestrian approaches, signalling drivers to slow down and stop. This enhancement ensures a safer crossing experience for all.

Students and staff are to remain alert and adhere to these signals at all times. Compliance is vital to maintaining a safe environment for everyone at our school.
