Thus, it is essential that students keep the following resources till the end of P6:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none">1) Science Textbooks: All students must minimally keep their Science Textbooks for reference and revision in preparation for PSLE.2) Science Workbooks & Worksheets (e.g. Topical Worksheets, Practice Papers and Assessment Papers): Students are strongly encouraged to keep the existing resources for reference and revision.3) Science Journals: Current Science Journals will continue to be used in 2026. The notes kept in the journals could serve as reference and help the students with their revision. <p>We seek parents' support to ensure the abovementioned to better support your child in their journey of learning Science. 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7.	<p><u>P6: Release of 2025 PSLE Results and Secondary 1 Posting Exercise</u></p> <p>The results of the 2025 Primary School Leaving Examination (PSLE) will be released on 25 November 2025 (Tuesday) at 11:00am. Arrangements have been made for school candidates to receive their results from their respective primary schools.</p> <p>P6 students are required to report to school (Multi-Purpose Hall) in school attire by 10:45am on that day to collect their PSLE results. Candidates who are unable to return to school to collect their results may appoint a proxy to do so on their behalf by 27 November 2025 (Thursday).</p> <p>Choosing Secondary Schools</p> <p>Students are encouraged to consider schools holistically when choosing a secondary school that would be a good fit for their educational needs, strengths and interests. This includes considering factors such as school culture, distinctive programmes, subject offerings, and Co-Curricular Activities.</p> <p>Students are also encouraged to include at least 2 to 3 schools within their 6 school choices with previous year's Cut-Off Points (COPs) that are less stringent than their PSLE score. Schools' COPs from last year's Secondary 1 (S1) Posting Exercise only serve as a reference and COPs can vary up to a few points from year to year, depending on the cohort's PSLE results and school choices in the S1 Posting Exercise. Including school choices with less stringent COPs may increase students' chances of securing a place in one of their chosen schools. Full Subject-Based Banding, fully implemented in secondary schools, will provide students greater customisation and flexibility in their learning.</p> <p>Students can visit the schools' open houses and explore their websites to find out more about the schools' offerings. Eligible students interested to study in CSS or SSS can apply directly by submitting their school application to CSS and SSS.</p> <p>Students who have applied directly should continue to submit the S1 Option Form to facilitate posting to another school of their choice if they are not admitted to CSS or SSS. More information on CSS and SSS can be found on their school websites (www.crestsec.edu.sg and www.spectra.edu.sg).</p> <p>The schools also organise open houses, where students can find out more about the schools' distinctive programmes, subjects, culture, ethos, and other offerings.</p> <p>Submission of Secondary 1 School Choices and Options</p> <p>Parents can submit their S1 school choices and options through the online S1 Portal accessible through MOE's S1 Posting website (www.moe.gov.sg/s1-posting), from 11:30am on 25 November 2025 (Tuesday) to 4:30pm on 1 December 2025 (Monday).</p>
