The National Mathematical Olympiad of Singapore (NMOS) is an annual mathematics competition for Singapore's Primary 5 students, organized by NUS High School of Mathematics and Science to identify and nurture mathematical talent. The competition has two rounds: a Preliminary Round for all participating students and a Special Round for top scorers. NMOS aims to foster interest in mathematics and problem-solving, potentially acting as a pathway for students to be selected for gifted programs or <a href="Integrated Programme">Integrated Programme</a> (IP) classes in secondary schools.
